

Article #1 - Volunteering: What's in it for me?

Is gliding different to other sports?

We do our sport in the air. So what? Does that make us special? Others do their sport on the ground, underneath the ground or on the water or underneath the water. Flying does not make us special. We are just different to the other sports in where we enjoy our leisure time. In the air! One thing we all have in common is that we need volunteers to operate our clubs or organisations.

Without the combined efforts of volunteers, a club or organisation would not be able to operate.

Effective leadership (that's the Committee and officials!) ensure the aims and values of volunteer involvement are promoted within the organisation, and that there is clear accountability for the implementation of volunteer involvement.

There are two steps to creating a volunteer culture.

- 1. **The first step** is to ensure that all members understand that the club or organisation relies on the input of volunteers. Without the combined efforts of volunteers, the organisation would not be able to operate. (That is, you can't just turn up and expect to get your jollies at the expense of someone else!)
- 2. **The second step** is the establishment of an appropriate culture. This is to ensure that members accept that membership brings with it an expectation of giving, contribution and commitment. There is also the expectation by members of the club that they are allowed to participate in whatever area of the club that they wish to volunteer and bring their expertise. The expectation should be that all volunteer efforts are shared across the membership and not just carried by the few.

Membership of an organisation should provide access to the activities, the facilities, the services provided and participation in social, competition and events, but also an opportunity to contribute to the effective operation of the organisation through voluntary effort. *This is a fundamental issue.* Membership denotes belonging and ownership. The members belong to and own the organisation and as such should be encouraged to promote and support the organisation's objectives.

Many volunteer-run sports and recreation organisations are operated by just a few key people who carry the load for the entire membership. This may be by design to retain power or advantage or it may be that recruitment and retention of members is so poor that there is no-one else to carry the load.

If clubs wish to retain members and happy ones at that, the focus on a volunteering culture is fundamental to a healthy club where spreading the volunteer load across the entire membership benefits all members.

So, what's in it for me?

The key to keeping members happy and wanting to return is by instigating an *inclusive culture* where your members feel valued, included and know that their club really wants their help and there is also reward and recognition for their efforts. People genuinely want their club or organisation to be a success and the reason they get involved is that, we "hoomans", like to be part of a like-minded community enjoying a like-minded activity. We have all felt the effects of the inability to be involved in our sport because of the COVID restrictions, so now is the time to revisit your club's culture and actively encourage volunteering and being involved.

Creating happy members is by positioning and promoting gliding as an *inclusive activity* where everyone (and that means everyone!) can be involved in whatever area or at whatever level they chose.

The intention should be to find everyone a job, or at least to get a commitment from all members that they are prepared to do a job and accept their commitment. In industry, this is called recruiting! In recruiting, we find people's skills sets and harness those skills for the good of the organisation.

Clubs are the same. If you have someone who is a Capital Infrastructure Investment Officer and they are licking the stamps, your club is not making the best use of its members' skill sets! So, do you know what your members' skills sets are?

So, what are the 7 key elements to volunteering? Let's look at Cricket Australia:

THE SEVEN CYCLES OF VOLUNTEER MANAGEMENT

1	RECRUITMENT	Recruiting the right people into the right roles at your Club or Association is vital. This can include identifying tasks and roles, the time and number of volunteers required, who does the task and role now, and when will it finish.
2	PLACE	The process of promoting the tasks to be completed, attracting volunteers to do the tasks, screening a volunteer's suitability to perform the task, selecting and appointing volunteers to roles.
3	INDUCT	The process of welcoming volunteers to the Club or Association, informing volunteers of Club or Association policies and procedures, and establishing preferred communication methods.
4	TRAIN	Educating volunteers on specific information for the role, and additional learning and development opportunities to enhance knowledge and skills.
5	SUPERVISE	The process of monitoring and providing feedback to the volunteer on performance in achieving the tasks.
6	RECOGNISE	The process of acknowledging a volunteer's contribution.
7	REPLACE	The process of filling vacated positions and the importance of succession planning.
