Regional Sports Assembly

Who are the Regional Sports Assembly? Your best friend, that's who! The Regional Sports Assembly do the groundwork of supporting grassroots sport & recreation clubs on behalf of Sport & Recreation Victoria (SRV) in regional areas and are funded by VicSport to assist clubs with the following:

- Providing resources and assistance in grant writing and financial help
- Facility and asset advice
- Up-skilling & advice on general club matters and overall club strategy
- Club accreditation programs such as 'Good Sports', liquor licensing and any other regulatory matters
- Council relationships and networking links
- General advice and support as required

SRV & VicHealth fund and support the Regional Sports Assembly to be on the ground and doing everything they can for regional clubs and associations. I encourage everyone to seek them out (and I have contact information for your relevant regions, so call or email me) and use them as the resource that the state government has created them to be. If they don't have all of the answers or information you need, they are pretty good at knowing who would in most cases, so why wouldn't you utilise their help??

VSA Funding

Just in case you didn't know, VSA receives a grant from Sport & Recreation Victoria so that we are able to carry out and support training initiatives, such as Airworthiness courses and coaching courses along with subsidising various programs, among other things.
