Hot Weather Resources

Looking ahead to this summer, The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) has reported that daytime temperatures are likely to be above average across most of Australia between October-January.

Over the past three years, Vicsport, in partnership with the Australian Centre for Injury in Sport and It's Prevention, has developed a suite of new resources to assist sport and recreation organisations to mitigate against the risks of exertional <u>heat illnesses</u> in sport.

Resources include:

- Hot Weather Guidelines for Sport & Active Recreation
- Policy templates for State Sport Associations, Regional Sports Assemblies, clubs and associations
- Posters / fact sheets to promote individual preparation, first aid treatment and identification of the signs and symptoms of heat illness

Print out these resources and put on your club noticeboard....not everyone is an old hand at gliding, and waiting for a launch or working on the airfield in the heat can cause heat illnesses that affect your members' safety.

What is a VSA Accredited YouthGlide Centre?

A VSA Accredited YouthGlide Centres (VSA YGC) initiative is based on the British Gliding Association Junior gliding centres and with the kind permission of the BGA, we have been able to utilize the framework to develop our own. What does all this mean?

Any VSA club that has received accreditation as a VSA YouthGlide Centre can demonstrate to parents and the community that it has policies, procedures and support systems in place to encourage pilots aged under 25 and that they will be treated with inclusion and respect. The club will have demonstrated an ongoing commitment, as part of their club activities, to pursue excellence with a focus on Junior Pilots.

Accreditation Requirements will be advised to Club Presidents shortly.

Yes, it's been advised a number of times, but just to go over it again.....

It is fantastic to see so many juniors coming up through the ranks and taking on gliding and going solo and beyond! **BUT**....our young people are minors and we must *Play by the Rules*. Please complete the <u>Child Protection online courses</u> provided for free by Victorian State Government to ensure that you know what the rules are in relation to working with children and your responsibilities to your young club members.

Please also ensure that you have the <u>VSA Child Safety Statement of Commitment</u> (VSA About/Governance) on your noticeboard or use this to create your own club statement as part of your club rules.

VSA Policies

As you know, VSA has been busy developing Codes of Conduct and other policies reflecting the governments initiatives to ensure all members of gliding clubs are treated fairly and with respect.
