It was only last weekend that Roger was out at the airfield, climbing in, over and under VH-NDG in order to diligently perform this year's annual maintenance. It is difficult to accept that he has departed, and that his characteristic 'Greetings!' will no longer be heard upon entering the workshop or clubhouse."

It is with great shock and sadness that we advise that Terry Knight, member of Alpine Soaring Mt Beauty and The Gliding Club of Victoria, passed away suddenly walking to a beautiful waterfall in the bush. A celebration of Terry's life and achievements would require a



library of books. Briefly Terry, was a Pharmacist, Scientist, Photographer, Botanist and Administrator. His interests incruded HAM radio and electronics, mechanical and vehicle maintenance (especially Land Rovers) and most importantly Aviation and Gliding. He could fix almost anything and built two houses, the first in Darwin that survived Cyclone Tracey and then his beautiful retirement home in Mt Beauty. His ability to fix the winch, the retrieve car, build a solar charging station or advise the committee on finance or insurance is unparalleled. Terry is irreplaceable and already missed by Family and Friends close to him.

PLAY BY THE RULES MODULES

VSA Committee is working through the <u>Sports Integrity Australia "E-Learning" Play by the Rules</u> <u>modules</u>, most of which are an accreditation via GFA JustGo. So, go check it out! Since the findings from the Royal Commission into Child Abuse, the laws and rules have changed. To gain funding, we must adhere to those rules if we are to effectively engage with young people and encourage them into the sport.

Eventually all club committees and then all members will be encouraged to progress through the modules.

START TO TALK CAMPAIGN

Start to Talk is a new national awareness campaign that promotes Child Safe Sport. The aim of **Start to Talk** is to encourage parents and sporting organizations to discuss how they can work together to create a child safe environment.
