

Strengths

AI AND YOUR CLUB!

Do you need to write a newsletter, press release, strategy plan, development plans or branding for your club? Get onto the Artificial Intelligence platforms and reduce your time and energy to produce documentation.

The recent Sport Community seminar on the use of AI was most informative. Many clubs, including Gliding VicTas are utilizing this technology and it saves an enormous amount of time to produce documentation and assist in areas that you may not have the expertise. Most programs are free to use for the purposes you need.

Check out <u>ChatGPT</u>. ChatGPT, which stands for Chat Generative Pre-trained Transformer, is a large language model-based chatbot developed by OpenAI which enables users to refine and steer a conversation towards a desired length, format, style, level of detail, and language. ChatGPT V3 is free and V4 is a paid service.

Another AI platform is Bard which is a conversational generative artificial intelligence chatbot developed by Google. You will need a Google account to access.

Differences between the two platforms? ChatGPT is better for generating content, ie., newsletters, press releases, strategy plans, development plans, especially when data is given, such as summarizing an article.

Bard is made for research using real-time data, so users can ask about current conditions such as the weather.

AND for a lot of fun to create merchandise, branding, posters and promo material, check out Midjourney. To start generating images with Midjourney, you'll need to subscribe to a plan with the basic being \$10 per month.

Ways to Improve Your Clubs Organisational Direction

Here are 5 actionable things your club can do:

- 1. Data-Driven Decision Making: Utilise data for informed decisions. Gather feedback from club members, review registration numbers, and assess participation history to understand your club's trajectory.
- 2. Analyse and Assess: Consider, discuss, and document your club's strengths, weaknesses, and opportunities. Identify areas for growth and improvement.
- 3. Smart Goal Setting: Establish clear, realistic goals with achievable time frames for monitoring progress. Consider available time and resources when planning.
- 4. Create a Clear, Step-by-Step Plan: Assign tasks to committee or club members, and maximize efficiency by completing tasks between committee meetings. Maintain regular check-ins and offer support as needed.
- 5. Utilise Resources: Don't hesitate to seek assistance when required. Utilise online resources, tap into support from state or national sporting organizations, and explore potential grants or council funding opportunities.
