A season of big events during 2023/24 summer!

The World Gliding Championships were held at Narromine in December 23, the 2023 Multi-Class Nationals at Benalla in January 24 and the Coaching Week at Horsham following by the Horsham Week competition and finally the Two Seat Nationals at Tocumwal.

So far, the gliding summer season has been an interesting one to say the least! Wet, hot, inversions, fires, floods! Is it climate change affecting us? From most reports, it has been a struggle and our normal great long distances have been few and far between. But, onwards and upwards and it's time to do some great flights in the Autumn season!

What was very noticeable at all competitions was the lack of women pilots and young pilots attending. This is of concern to not only Gliding VicTas, but also to the State Government where the funding comes from for us to sponsor and subsidise events.

As we move forward, Gliding VicTas will see some changes in the way funding is supplied and guidelines will be reviewed. This is in line with legislative requirements by Sport & Recreation Victoria and the parameters around the funding that we receive.

Thus to start the ball rolling, all funding going forward will be subject to assessment in relation to Play by the Rules training and the Gliding VicTas Inclusion & Diversity policy.

PLAY BY THE RULES

Make sure your club is across the <u>Fair Play Code</u> and has a copy on your club noticeboard and is undertaking the Play by the Rules training! All funding will be predicated on member clubs initiating a program of ensuring that all their members are undertaking **Play by the Rules** training and loading their credentials into the Gliding Australia JustGo portal.

What VSA does....

The Victorian Soaring Association (VSA) or the nomenclature *Gliding VicTas* is the regional organisation representing all Gliding Clubs and their members in Victoria and Tasmania. We promote gliding and the interests of all pilots who fly motorless aircraft.

Gliding VicTas is recognised by Gliding Australia and the Victorian State Government as the peak administration body for all glider pilots and gliding clubs in the Victoria and Tasmania regions. Its members are gliding clubs, including near border areas like Tocumwal and Corowa. We unite all VSA member glider pilots and represent their interests.

What do we do?

We promote gliding, engage in activities that add value to the gliding community and proactively represent the interests of all Vic/Tas member glider pilots to the State Government and at the Gliding Australia.

We do this by:

- Promoting gliding as an outdoor activity that assists in personal development and helps people understand the natural environment
- Advising people how to start gliding
- Coordinating services development through volunteer training programs covering airworthiness, flight instruction and sports coaching
- Promoting gliding clubs and encouraging membership
- Facilitating interclub and member communications
- Building and maintaining relationships with Victorian State Government Departments and Agencies to progress mutual Sports development objectives and to obtain funding to support these.
- Participating in the direction and administration of the affairs of the Gliding Australia.

The VSA is an Incorporated Association in the State of Victoria. The officers of the VSA are a group of Volunteers elected annually by the members in accordance with prescribed nomination and voting processes associated with the conduct of the annual general meeting of the VSA.
