Horsham Week Coaching and Competition 2025

The 59th Horsham Week Competition, held from 1st to 8th February 2025, was a successful event despite facing significant challenges due to nearby bushfires. It was run in conjunction with the Victorian State Championships, which crowned state champions in 15M, Open/18M, and Club classes. The event was preceded by Coaching Week, designed to support new pilots entering competition and develop cross-country skills.

Coaching Week, led by Tim Shirley and supported by a strong coaching team, was heavily impacted by bushfires in the **Grampians and Little Desert**, resulting in only two flying days. Despite severe fire threats, including near-evacuation, firefighting operations based at Horsham Airport, and extensive damage to surrounding areas, one pilot was still able to achieve their **Glider Pilot Certificate (GPC)**.

The Horsham Week Competition proceeded more smoothly, with 26 pilots competing. Conditions improved, allowing tasking primarily to the north and east of Horsham. Female pilots, including Leonie Furze, Diana Schuit, and Anoushka De Chelard, performed strongly in Club Class, achieving day wins and podium finishes.

Winners included:

- **Open/18M**: *Ryan Driscoll* (Nimbus 3t)
- 15M/Standard: Jack Hart (ASW20B)
- Club Class: Michael Strathern (ASW20)

The competition is organized and run by pilots themselves, ensuring sustainability through shared responsibilities. The Horsham Flying Club once again provided vital support in hosting the event.

The report concluded with optimism for Horsham Week 2026, starting 31st January (Coaching Week) and 7th February (Competition Week),



encouraging broader participation-especially from younger pilots and two-seat gliders-to continue building the next generation of soaring pilots.

GRANTS OPEN

Qantas Regional Grants - What is the Qantas Regional Grant?

The Qantas Regional Grants program offers substantial support to Australian-based communities, focusing on projects that enrich regional areas. With a commitment that stretches back to its first flights in outback Queensland in 1920, Qantas continues to foster local economic activity and job support in these communities.

This initiative aims to sustain brighter futures by offering financial, flight, and marketing support to charities, organisations, projects, and individuals enhancing the spirit of Australia.

Qantas Regional Grant level of support

- The Qantas Regional Grants program offers recipients a combination of: Cash grants, Flights in kind, and Marketing support.
- While the program does not specify exact minimum or maximum individual grant amounts, the total available pool is \$2 million, with past allocations tailored according to the specific needs of each successful applicant.
- Applicants have to nominate the value of each grant component required for their work and clearly outline how it would be used to further their regional cause.
- Co-Contribution Requirements: None specified.
